## 2013 FIG SPECIFIC JUDGES' RULES FOR RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS

Revised 13.8.2013

The FIG has approved the 2013 FIG General Judges' Rules which are applicable to all competitive disciplines. The specific rules and clarifications listed below apply only to this discipline and are in compliance with the General Judges' Rules.

### ARTICLE 1: JUDGES' COURSES

#### 1.1 Intercontinental Courses

Each Federation may register a maximum of 4 judges to attend the Course. The Intercontinental Course will last 4 days (plus two days examination). The Course will end with a written and practical examination.

#### 1.2 International Courses

The International Course will last 5 days (with the examination days). The Course will end with a written examination of the Code of Points and a practical examination.

#### Retest:

- Judges who wish to retest after an Intercontinental or an International Judges' Course must submit the retesting form to the FIG Office and to the RG TC President prior to the international course (retest).

### ARTICLE 2: EXAMINATION

#### 2.1 Summary of Evaluation - Method for Examinations

- Theoretical examination
- Practical examination Execution
- Practical examination Difficulty

Theory: 100 multiple choice questions

Practical: Analyzing and judging 10 individual exercises (2 for each apparatus) and 4 group exercises (2 same apparatus + 2 different apparatus).

- 5 Individual Exercises (1 per each apparatus) for the Difficulty score.
- 2 Group Exercises (1 same apparatus + 1 different apparatus) for the Difficulty score.
- 5 Individual Exercises (1 per each apparatus) for the Execution score.
- 2 Group Exercises (1 same apparatus + 1 different apparatus) for the Execution score.

D and E Juries evaluation during the examination: see “Evaluation Scale”.

The Summary of Evaluation - Method for Examinations is provisional and will be confirmed at the conclusion of Intercontinental Course.

## 2.2 Evaluation scale

The percentage score required for each category in the examinations is provisional. It will be fixed by the Technical Committee at the conclusion of the Intercontinental Course. The score once fixed will remain the same for the remainder of the Cycle.

To pass the examination and receive a category the following minimum requirements must be met:

The difference is calculated by comparing the score of the judge and the reference score. According to the level of the resulting score, the score indicated in the first column is given. The average score, multiplied by 2, results in the judge's score to one tenth of a point.

## ARTICLE 3 MISCELLANEOUS

### 3.1 Judge's draw

For the D panel Draw priority is given to the higher ranked judges.

- In the draw for CIII at World Championships, priority will be given to neutral Cat. I and Cat. II judges.

## FINAL PROVISIONS

The principles of the FIG General Judges' Rules have been approved by the Executive Committee. The details of the Specific Rules for each discipline were developed by the Technical Committees and have been modified by the Statutes Commission and the Presidential Commission following the authorization of the Executive Committee.
